**Notes:**

EDoB = Estimated Date of Birth – alternatively, a possible range of years.

Cordwainer = Pronounced 'cordner'. A worker or trader in leather goods. The name derives from Cordovan, a resident of the Spanish town famous for its fine leather. In general, its use means a shoemaker or cobbler.

In the 1790s, the microfilm copy of the Register of Burials, especially from 1792-1794, is very faint and almost impossible to read with any certainty. Evidently the pages are stained, torn, etc. It is also unindexed here.

Searched the St Nicholas Death Registers until the end of 1826 – carry on from here next time.
